



- If you haven't already, DECLARE A LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY for your jurisdiction
- SUBMIT A REQUEST FOR PUBLIC ASSISTANCE to the State
- DOCUMENT ALL ACTIONS, TIME, AND COSTS related to the disaster
 - If you're not sure, **STILL DOCUMENT** it as part of the response for later review
- CREATE A SINGLE COST CODE to tag all the expenses to
- FILE AN INSURANCE CLAIM, if you have coverage for business interruption or other associated lines
- FOLLOW YOUR PROCUREMENT REGULATIONS and 2 CFR Part 200
